Initial and Continued Claims Up from December 2024

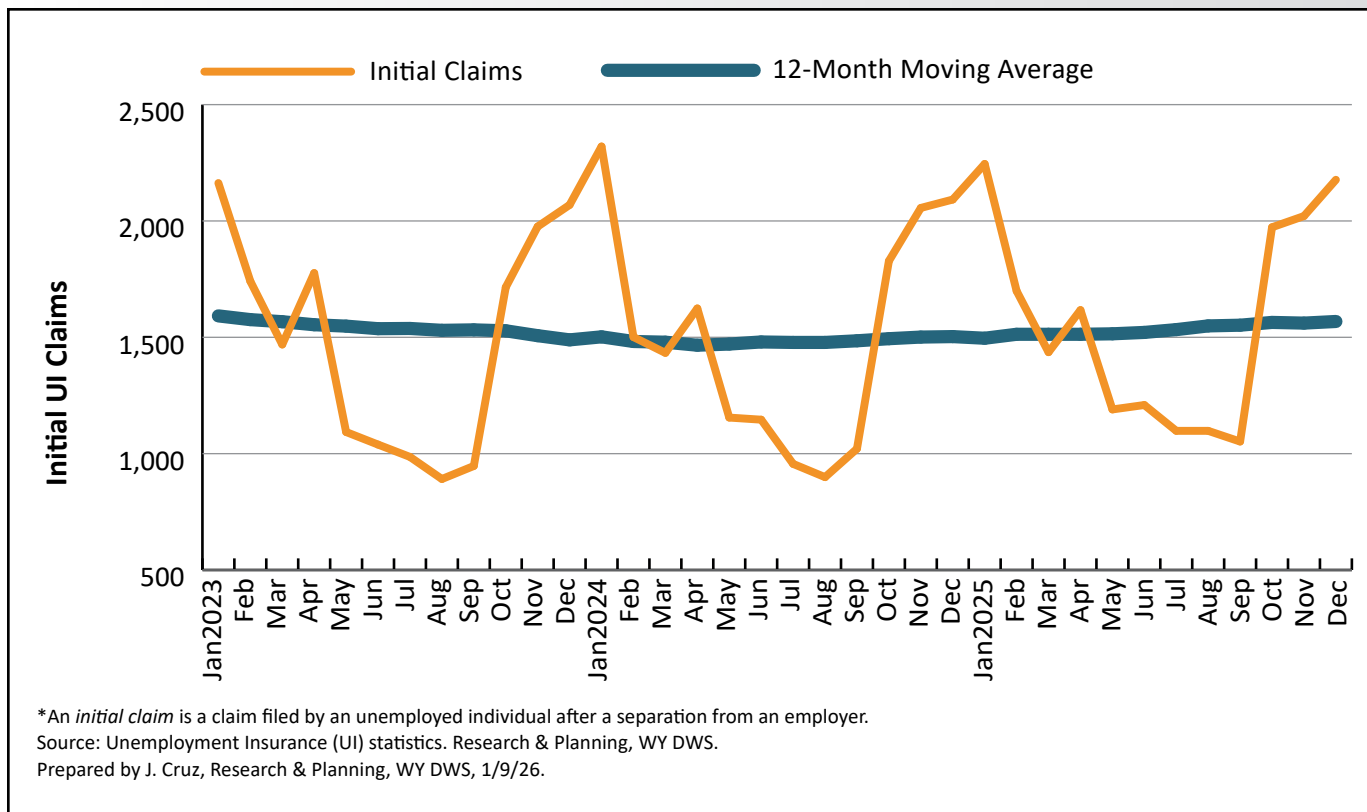


Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming, January 2023 to December 2025

Both initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming (see Definitions, page 9) increased over the year (see Figure 1 below and Figure 2, page 4). Initial and continued claims also increased over the month; both typically increase in the winter months and peak in January.

Initial Claims

There were 2,177 initial claims in December 2025, up 85 (or 4.1%) from December 2024. Initial claims increased by 156 (7.7%) over the month.

The industries with the largest numbers

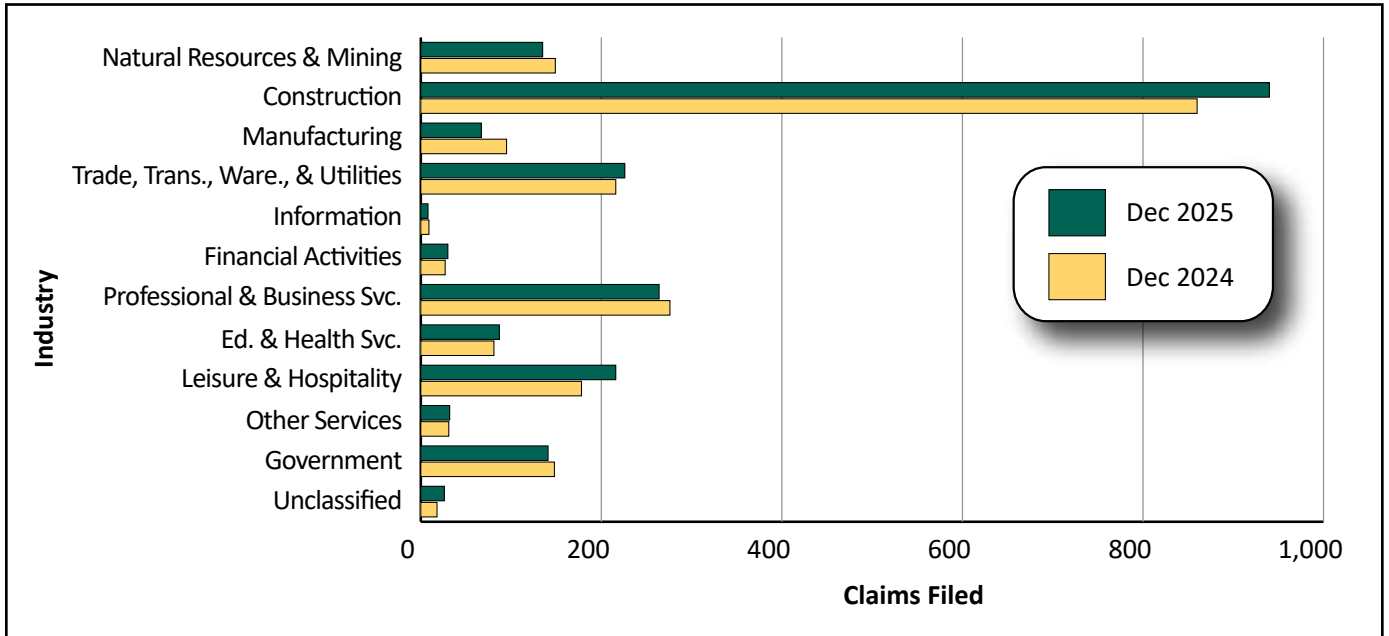


Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, December 2024 and December 2025

of initial claims included construction (940); professional & business services (264); trade, transportation, & utilities (226); and leisure & hospitality (216; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6). Construction increased the most over the year with 80 more claims (9.3%), followed by leisure & hospitality with 38 more claims (21.3%). Manufacturing had the largest over-the-year decrease with 28 fewer initial claims (-29.5%).

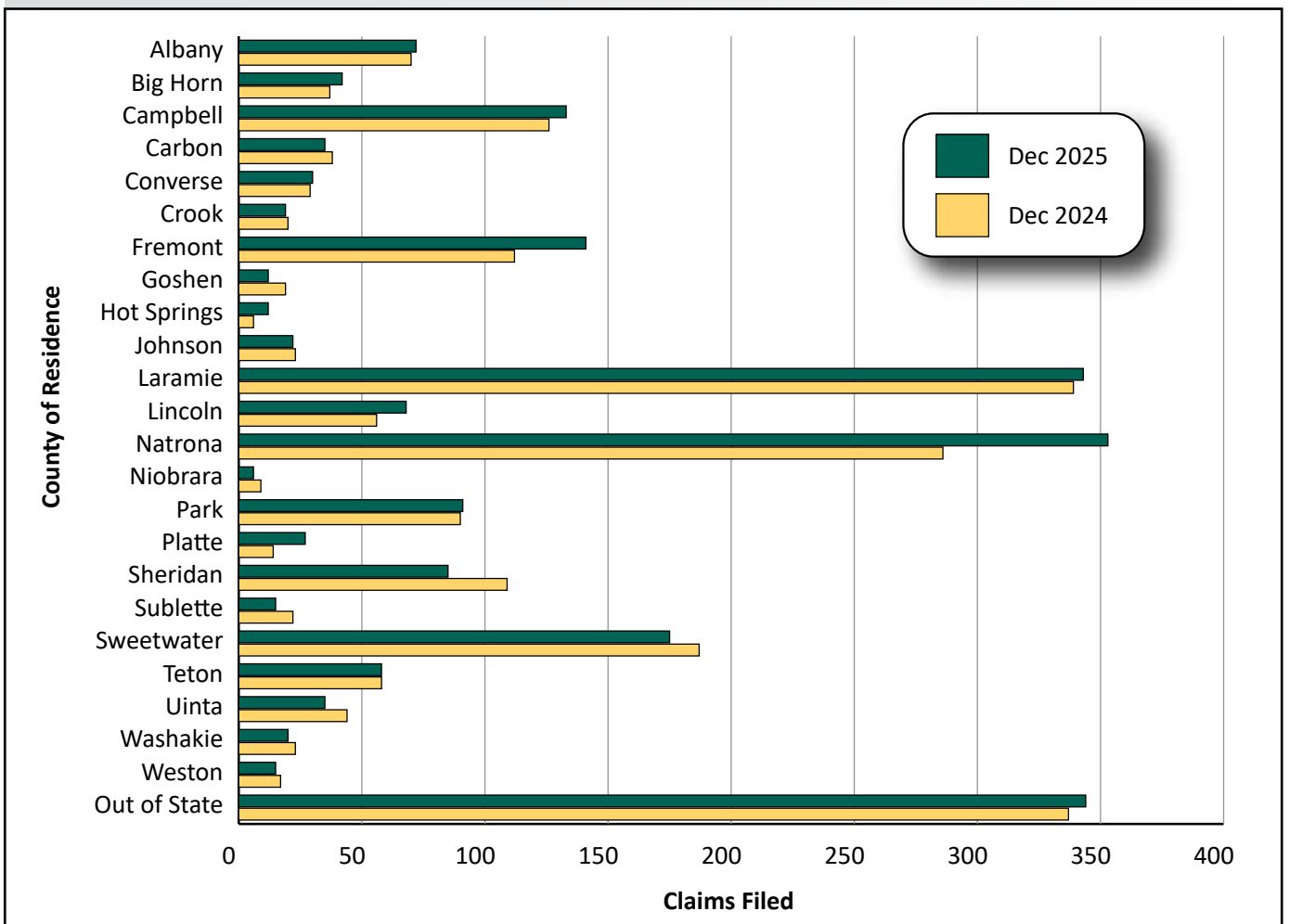


Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, December 2024 and December 2025

Natrona had the largest number of initial claims with 353, followed by Laramie (343), Sweetwater (175), and Fremont (141) counties (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9). In addition, there were 344 out-of-state claimants.

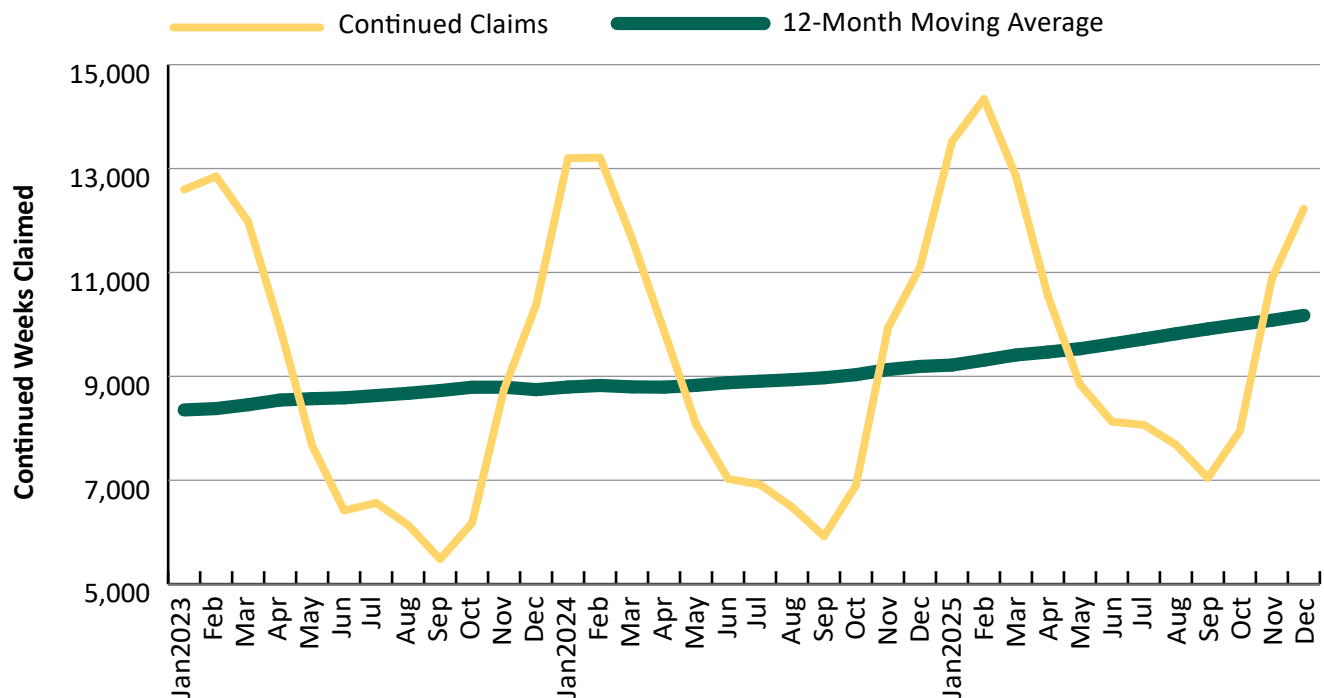
Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 11,096 in December 2024 to 12,228 in December 2025 (1,132, or 10.2%). There were 3,749 unique claimants in December 2025, decreasing both over the month (-63, or -1.7%) and over the year (-284, or -7.0%).

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction

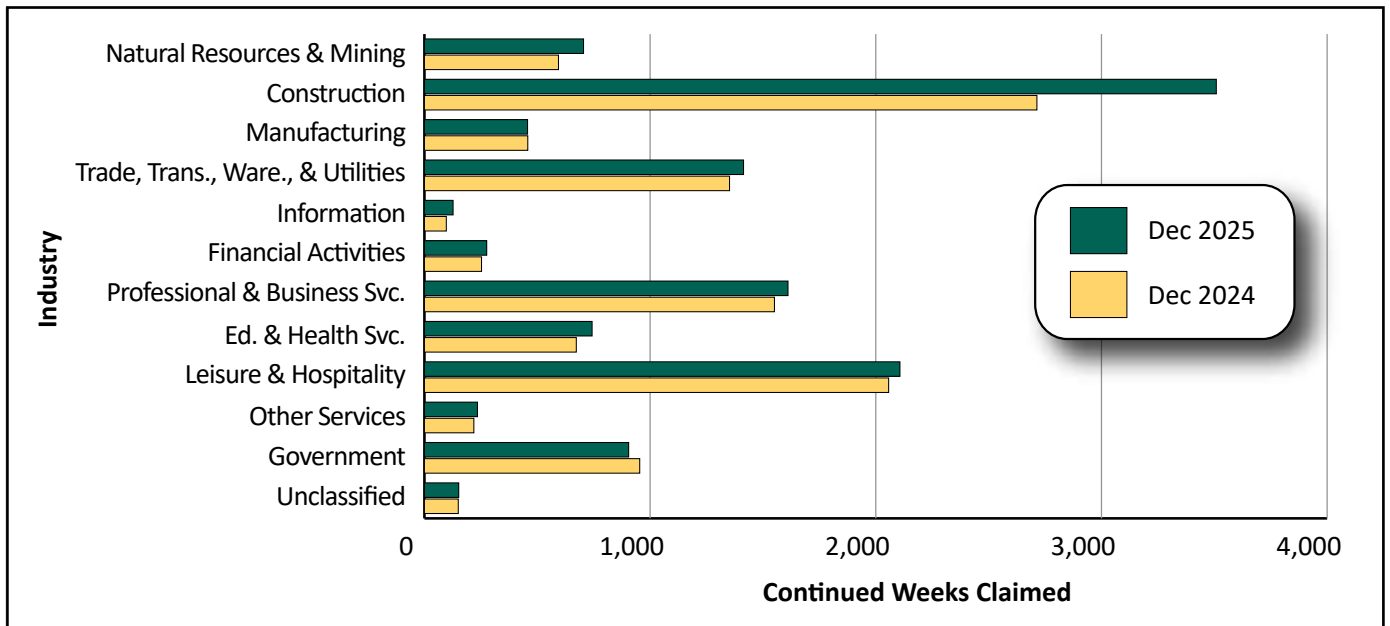


Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, December 2024 and December 2025

(3,509); leisure & hospitality (2,107); professional & business services (1,611); and trade, transportation, & utilities (1,414; see Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8). Construction had the largest over-the-year increase (795, or 29.3%), followed by mining, including oil & gas (113, or 21.9%). The greatest over-the-year decrease in continued claims was seen in federal government (-139, or -25.0%).

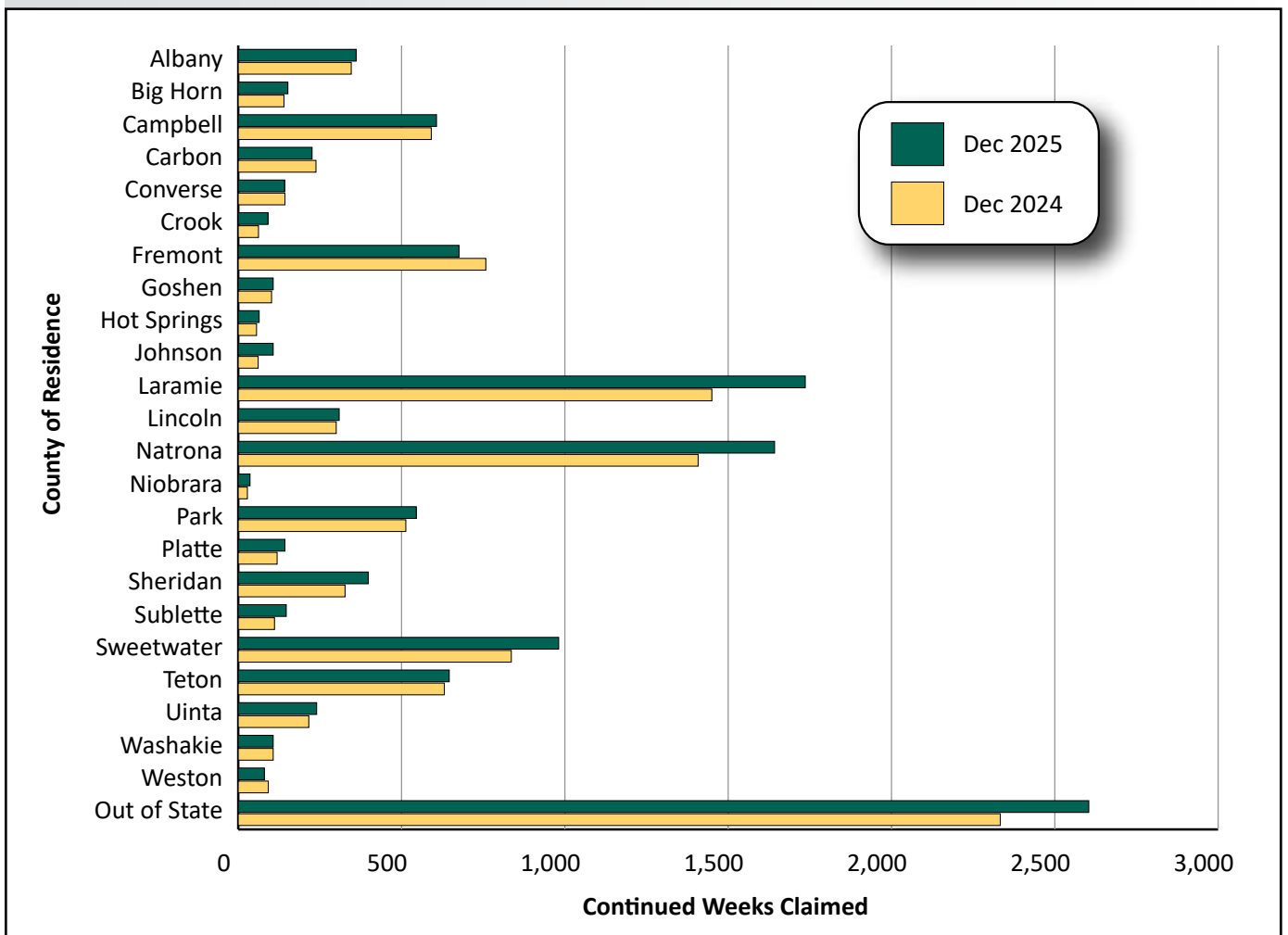


Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, December 2024 and December 2025

Laramie County had the largest number of continued weeks claimed with 1,736, followed by Natrona (1,642), Sweetwater (981), and Fremont (676) counties (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). There were 2,604 out-of-state continued weeks claimed, up 271 (11.6%) over the year.



*A person who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment then files a *continued claim* to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
