Continued Claims Down More than 80% from Prior-Year

In June 2021, Wyoming continued to experience substantial over-theyear decreases in the number of initial (-77.9%) and continued (-82.6%) Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9). Despite these decreases, the number of initial and continued claims remained higher than pre-COVID-19 pandemic levels.

Initial Claims

June 2021 marked the fourth consecutive month of over-the-year decreases in initial UI claims in Wyoming. There were 1,811 initial claims in June 2021, down from 8,180 in June 2020 (-6,369 or -77.9%). Initial claims peaked in April 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and have largely trended




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2011 to June 2021

downward since. See Figure 1.

The number of claims declined from the prior year in all industries. In the private sector, substantial decreases were seen in mining (-886, or -89.1%), leisure & hopitality (-727, or -80.7%), construction (-448, or -57.7%), and education & health services (-361, or -59.3%), among others. The industry labeled unclassified continued to see one of the top decreases of initial claims (-1,554,




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, June 2020 and June 2021

or -87.7%). Initial claims in government decreased by 76.5% (-536 claims). See Table 1 (page 5) and Figure 3 (page 6).




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, May 2020 and May 2021

Initial claims also decreased from prior year levels in nearly all counties, including Natrona (-1,288, or -80.3%), Laramie (-745, or -74.6%), and Campbell (-696, or -82.2%) counties. The number of out-of-state claimants decreased by 748 (-74.5%). See Figure 4 (page 6) and Table 3 (page 9).


Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 83,807 in June 2020 to 14,561 in June 2021 (-69,246, or -82.6%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 24,591 to 4,692 (-19,899, or

-80.9%). See Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7.




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, June 2020 and June 2021

Continued claims declined in all industries over the year, including leisure & hospitality (-14,146, or -90.2%), mining (-12,130, or -91.8%), construction (-5,697, or -70.1%), and professional & business services (-3,789, or -79.2%). Claims in the unclassified industry decreased by 82.6% (-12,165). See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.

Continued claims also fell in every county, with the greatest decreases seen in Natrona (-13,492, or -85.0%), Laramie (-7,715 or -80.1%), and Teton (-6,363 or -94.4%) counties. The number of total weeks claimed by out-of-state recipients decreased by 10,186 (-83.2%). See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, June 2020 and June 2021

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
