Initial Claims at Lowest Level for October Since 2001

There were 1,824 initial claims in October 2018, the lowest level for the month of October since 2001.

Initial Claims

In October 2018, initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims decreased by 24.4% (-588 claims) compared to 2017.

The largest decreases were seen in leisure & hospitality (-199 claims, or- 23.7%) and trade, transportation, warehousing, & utilities (-110 claims, or -36.8%). The majority of industries experienced a decline in the number of initial claims with the exception of natural resources & mining, which had an increase of 12 claims (16.7%). The information sector remained unchanged.

Teton County had the largest number of initial claims (294), followed by Natrona (203) and Laramie counties (194).

Continued Claims

There were 2,054 claimants with continued claims, a decrease of 30.8% (916 fewer individuals) over the year. Continued weeks claimed for the month of October were at the lowest level since 2006, with 6,121 weeks.

Total continued weeks claimed decreased by 27.6% (2,648 fewer weeks claimed). All industry sectors experienced a decrease in over-the-year continued weeks claimed with the exception of leisure & hospitality (87 weeks, or 7.2%) and information (35 weeks, or 31.8%). Construction experienced a substantial decrease of 680 weeks (-41.3%), followed by trade, transportation, warehousing, & utilities (-531 weeks, or -33.2%).

Natrona and Laramie counties saw the greatest decreases (518 and 460 weeks, respectively). Sublette County was the only county with an increase (24 weeks, or 44.0%).





Figure 1: Total Number of New Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2009 to October 2018



Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, October 2018




