

Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Information, March 2017: Initial and Continued Claims Decline

Initial Claims

Total initial claims decreased by 44.6% (-1,604 claims) from March 2016 to March 2017. Substantial over-the-year decreases were seen in natural resources & mining (-644 claims, or -83.4%), construction (-264, or -33.8%), and wholesale trade (-142, or -79.8%). New initial claims have decreased from prior year levels for seven consecutive months.

At the county level, initial claims decreased over the year in most counties. The most substantial decreases were seen in Campbell (-374 claims, or -69.0%), Natrona (-364, or -54.2%), and Sweetwater (-181, or -58.5%) counties. Out-of-state initial claims decreased 40.4% (-239 claims) from March 2016 to March 2017.

Continued Claims

From March 2016 to March 2017, the total number of unique claimants decreased by 30.4% (-2,680 individuals) while the number of continued weeks claimed decreased by 30.7% (-11,026 individuals). The number of individuals who exhausted their UI benefits also declined over the year (-11.7%, or -73 individuals).

At the industry level, the greatest decreases in continued weeks claimed were seen in natural resources & mining (-4,824 weeks, or -77.8%) and trade, transportation, & utilities (-1,625, or -33.9%).

Most of the counties that experienced substantial decreases in initial claims also had fewer continued weeks claimed over the year. The largest decreases were seen in Campbell (-2,194 weeks, or -56.4%) and Natrona (-2,082, or -35.5%) counties.

The number of out-of-state weeks claimed decreased by 33.3% (-2,177 weeks).

The over-the-year decreases in the number of unique claimants, continued weeks claimed, and persons exhausting their UI benefits may indicate that claimants may have found work, exhausted their benefits, or left the *labor force*, which is defined as the total number of the civilian non-institutionalized population age 16 or older who are employed or unemployed (jobless, looking for a job, and available for work).

It is possible that many UI claimants may have left Wyoming and found employment in another state, making them no longer eligible to receive UI benefits. The number of jobs worked in Wyoming has consistently decreased since the start of the economic downturn that began in 2015Q2, while surrounding states like Colorado, Idaho, Montana, and Utah have experienced job growth (Moore, 2017). In addition, as noted by Bullard (2016), Wyoming's labor force shrank consistently throughout 2015 and 2016. As Wyoming lost jobs during the downturn, dislocated workers may have left the state and successfully found employment in another state.





Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, March 2017




