#### **Occupation vs. Industry**

#### **Industry**

- Group of establishments with similar products or services
- "Where you work"

#### **Occupation**

- Set of tasks that employees are paid to perform
- "What you do"



#### **Occupations vs. Industries**

#### **Industry Examples**

- Health care & social assistance
- Mining
- Retail trade
- Leisure & hospitality

#### **Occupation Examples**

- Registered nurse
- Roustabout
- Cashier
- Cooks, restaurant



#### **Occupations vs. Industries**

- Most occupations found in multiple industries
- Example: heavy & tractor-trailer truck driver
  - Transportation & warehousing
  - Mining, including oil & gas
  - Construction
  - Retail trade



#### **Criteria for In-Demand Occupations**

- At least 100 total projected annual openings
- An average hourly wage of at least \$21.07
  - MIT livable wage calculator




- Nearly 500 occupations
- Total projected annual openings
- Average hourly wage








- Remove outliers
- Maximum annual openings: 900
- Average hourly wage: \$60








- Apply criteria
  - At least 100 total annual openings
  - Wage of least \$21.07
- This divides the figure into4 quadrants








- Quadrant 1: bottom left
- Low demand, low wage
  - <100 annual openings</p>
  - <\$21.07 per hour</p>








- Quadrant 2: bottom right
- Low demand, high wage
  - <100 annual openings</p>
  - At least \$21.07 per hour








- Quadrant 3: upper left
- High demand, low wage
  - 100+ annual openings
  - <\$21.07 per hour</p>








- Quadrant 4: upper right
- High demand, high wage
  - 100+ annual openings
  - At least \$21.07 per hour







- High demand, high wage
- 36 occupations met these criteria





- Heavy & Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers
  - General & Operations Managers
- Bookkeeping, Accounting, & Auditing Clerks
  - Maintenance & Repair Workers, General
    - Registered Nurses
      - Carpenters
      - Electricians



#### **In-Demand Occupations**

## Of these occupations:

- 14 are "high skill"
  - 3 require postsecondary certificate
  - 8 require a bachelor's degree
  - 3 require a HS diploma AND an apprenticeship



#### **In-Demand Occupations**

## Changing the thresholds:

- 100 total projected annual openings, at least \$18.00 per hour
  - Increases from 36 to 51

- 50 total projected annual openings, at least \$21.07 per hour
  - Increases from 36 to 77
