
Economic Downturns and Youth

 - 2020Q2-2021Q1












Youth Population and Working in Wyoming, 2000-2023








Labor Force Participation Rate of Youth in the U.S., January 2000 to October 2024








Average Annual Earnings of Youth in WY, 2000-2023








Youth by Selected Industry of Employment, 2000-2023








Youth by Industry of Employment, 2000-2023








Youth Working in Construction, 2000-2023






Youth Working in Wyoming by Gender, 2000-2023




Average Quarters Worked, 2000-2023



- Lincoln (316, or 61.0%)
- Sheridan (269, or 24.9%)
- Hot Springs (37, or 19.6%)
- Laramie (517, or 15.2%)
- Crook (35, or 15.2%)
- Big Horn (46, or 13.9%)
- Campbell (223, or 11.2%)





Summary

- Increase in youth working the last few years
- Increase in youth working in health care, which may provide a potential career path
- Youth are working for longer periods
- Youth are earning more than in years past
