UI Claims Continue to Decrease from Pandemic Highs

Initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) in Wyoming continued to decline from prior-year levels in January 2022. Initial and continued claims also followed their normal seasonal patterns and increased from December to January.

Initial Claims




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2012 to January 2022

The number of initial UI claims continued to trend downward in January (see Figure 1) and decreased from prioryear levels for the 11th consecutive month. There were 2,620 initial claims in January 2022, down from 5,940 in January 2021 (-3,320 or -55.9%). All industries and




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, January 2021 and January 2022




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, January 2021 and January 2022

counties showed over-the-year decreases in initial claims (see Figures 3 and 4, page 6).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (945), unclassified (415), professional & business services (248), and trade, transportation, & utilities (241; see Table 1, page 5).

Natrona (404), Laramie (356), Sweetwater (220), Campbell (168), and Fremont (167) counties had the largest number of initial claims. In addition, there were 389 initial claims by out-of-state claimants (see Table 3, page 9).


Continued Claims

Continued claims also trended downward (see Figure 2) and declined from prior-year levels for the 10th consecutive month in January. The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 35,032 in January 2021 to 13,299 in January 2022 (-21,733, or -62.0%; see Table 2, page 7). The number of total unique claimants decreased from 11,450 to 4,432 (-7,018, or -61.3%) over the year.




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, January 2021 and January 2022




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, January 2021 and January 2022

Continued claims decreased from prioryear levels in all industries and counties (see Figures 5 and 6, page 8).

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (4,174), unclassified (2,725), professional & business services (1,234), and leisure & hospitality (974). There were also 1,148 continued weeks claimed in total government.

There were more continued weeks claimed for out-of-state claimants (2,281) than any single county in Wyoming. The counties with the greatest numbers of continued weeks claimed were Natrona (2,062), Laramie (1,794), Fremont (986), and Sweetwater (922).

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
