# Continued Claims Up 7.8% from March 2022

Initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) continued to decline over the year in Wyoming in March 2023. The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from prior-year levels for the second consecutive month, and the fourth time in the last five months.

#### **Initial Claims**


There were 1,469 initial claims in March 2023, down from 1,576 in March 2022 (-107, or -6.8%). This amount is 87.7% lower than when the pandemic began with 11,988 initial claims in

March 2020. Claims dropped 15.6% from February to March; this is common as initial claims decline from their winter month peaks in the spring (see Figure 1).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (421), leisure & hospitality

(232), trade, transportation, & utilities (219), and manufacturing (116; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 4, page 6).

Laramie (239), Natrona (217), Campbell (113), and Sweetwater (90) counties had the largest number of initial claims. In addition, there were 216 initial claims by out-of-state claimants (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9).


#### **Continued Claims**

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 11,522 in March 2022 to 12,419 in March 2023 (897, or 7.8%). Continued claims decreased 6.9% over the month, which is a common pattern historically (see Figure 2 and

Table 2, page 7). The number of unique claimants increased from 3,376 to 3,474 over the year (98, or 2.9%) over the year. Continued claims were 19,093 in March 2020, or 35.0% higher than current levels in March 2023.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (4,416), professional & business services (1,492), trade, transportation, & utilities (1,462), and leisure & hospitality (1,275; see Figure 6, page 8).

The counties with the greatest numbers of continued claims were Laramie (1,867), Natrona (1,801), and Fremont (1,010), along with 1,718 out-of-state claimants (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9).



<sup>\*</sup>A person who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment then files a *continued claim* to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, March 2022 and March 2023




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, March 2022 and March 2023




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, March 2022 and March 2023




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, March 2022 and March 2023

#### **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

**Continued Weeks Claimed:** The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
