Mining Sees Increase in Initial, Continued Claims

Both initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) followed their normal seasonal patterns and decreased from April to May. However, initial and continued claims increased compared to May 2023.

Initial Claims




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2014 to May 2024

There were 1,155 initial claims in May 2024 (see Figure 1), an increase of 62 claims (5.7%) over the year. Over the month, initial claims decreased by 469 (-28.9%).

The over-the-year increase in initial claims was driven by more claims in mining (40, or 62.5%) and professional &




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, May 2023 and May 2024

business services (39, or 41.5%; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6). Overthe-year decreases were seen in several industries, including education & health services (-19, or -16.7%), financial activities (-13, or -33.3%), and leisure & hospitality (-11, or -6.4%).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (269); trade, transportation, & utilities (183); leisure & hospitality (161); and professional & business services (133).






Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, May 2023 and May 2024

Natrona County had the most initial claims with 202. This was followed by Laramie (200), Campbell (111), and Sweetwater (67) counties, along with 166 out-of-state claimants (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9).

Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 7,668 in May 2023 to 8,077 in May 2024 (409, or 5.3%; see Figure 2). The number of unique claimants increased from 2,476 to 2,578 (102, or 4.1%) over the year (see Table 2, page 7). Over the month, continued claims decreased by 1,796 (-18.2%) and unique claimants decreased by 1,059 (-29.1%).




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, May 2023 and May 2024

Over-the-year increases in continued claims were led by mining (160, or 36.4%); trade, transportation, & utilities (129, or 11.2%); and construction (109, or 7.8%; see Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8). Manufacturing showed a considerable over-the-year decrease in continued weeks claimed (-110, or -26.3%). The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included leisure & hospitality (1,694), construction (1,498), and trade, transportation, & utilities (1,279).




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, May 2023 and May 2024

There were more out-of-state claimants (1,301) than from any Wyoming county (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). The counties with the most continued weeks claimed were Laramie (1,227), Natrona (1,085), and Teton (811).



^{*}A person who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment then files a *continued claim* to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
