# Initial, Continued Claims Up Over the Year

nitial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) remained largely unchanged from May to June, while continued claims declined substantially. Initial and continued claims both increased compared to June 2023.

#### **Initial Claims**




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2014 to June 2024

There were 1,146 initial claims in June 2024, down slightly (-9, or -0.8%) from May 2024. Initial claims are often at their lowest levels during the warm summer months each year (see Figure 1), as employment picks up in industries such as construction and leisure & hospitality.

Over the year, initial claims increased

by 107, or 10.3%. This increase was largely due to higher initial claims in the mining sector, where claims rose by 52, or 118.2% (see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6). However, initial claims in mining were unusually low in 2023, so this increase brought claims in mining back to levels consistent with recent years.

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (221); education & health

services (208); trade, transportation, & utilities (178); and leisure & hospitality (115). Financial activities decreased the most over the year, with 18 fewer claims (-43.9%).

Laramie County had the most initial claims with 182, followed by Natrona (168), Campbell (92), and Fremont (86) counties (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9). In addition, there were 162 out-of-state claimants.

#### **Continued Claims**




Figure 2: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Continued Weeks Claimed for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2014 to June 2024

Continued claims followed their normal seasonal pattern and decreased over the month (-1,050, or -13.0%; see Figure 2). Over the year, the total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 6,418 to 7,027 (609, or 9.5%; see Table 2, page 7). The total number of unique claimants increased from 2,250 to 2,489

(239, or 10.6%) over the year, and dropped by 89 (-3.5%) over the month.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (1,277); trade, transportation, & utilities (1,196); education & health services (900); and leisure & hospitality (822). Financial activities showed a considerable over-the-year decrease in continued claims (-111, or -33.6%; see Figure 5, page 8). Several industries showed over-the-year increases in continued weeks claimed, led by mining (292, or 74.1%); again, continued claims in mining were unusually low in 2023 and returned to more common levels in 2024.

Laramie County had the most continued claims with 1,144, followed by Natrona (1,092), Campbell (628), and Fremont (479) counties (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). There were 1,013 out-of-state continued claims as well.




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, June 2023 and June 2024




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, June 2023 and June 2024

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


Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, June 2023 and June 2024




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, June 2023 and June 2024

#### **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

**Continued Weeks Claimed:** The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
