# Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, July 2022 UI Claims Approach 10-Year Low in July 2022

Initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) in Wyoming continued to decline from prior-year levels in July 2022, and both neared decade lows for any given month.

### **Initial Claims**

There were 981 initial claims in July 2022, down from 1,457 in July 2021 (-476 or -32.7%). This amount is even less than pre-pandemic levels of 1,266 initial claims in July 2019 (-285, or -22.5%). The 981 claims in July were the seventh lowest for any month dating back to January 2012.

## **UI Claims Online**

Weekly, monthly, and annual Unemployment Insurance claims for Wyoming are available online at https://doe.state.wy.us/LMI/UI.htm.




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2012 to April 2022

Initial claims peaked in April 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and have largely trended downward since (see Figure 1).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included

construction (176), trade, transportation, & utilities (124), government (90) and professional & business services (88; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6).

Laramie (167) and Natrona (133) counties had the largest number of initial claims, followed by Campbell (76), Fremont (75), and Sweetwater (74) counties. In addition, there were 141 initial claims by out-of-state claimants (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9).

#### **Continued Claims**




Figure 2: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Continued Weeks Claimed for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2012 to July 2022

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 10,691 in July 2021 to 6,351 in July 2022 (-4,340, or -40.6%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 3,506 to 2,119 (-1,387, -39.6%; see Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7). Continued claims were down 24.7% from the 8,439 in July 2019. The 6,351 claims made July the second lowest month for continued weeks claimed since January 2012, second to only 6,225 in August 2018.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (1,044), trade, transportation & utilities (710), education & health services, (688) and government (626; see Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8).

There were more continued weeks claimed for out-of-state claimants (1,152) than any single county in Wyoming (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). The counties with the greatest numbers of continued weeks claimed were Natrona Laramie (911), Natrona (867), Fremont (667), and Sweetwater (442).




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, July 2021 and July 2022




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, July 2021 and July 2022




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, July 2021 and July 2022




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, July 2021 and July 2022

# **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

**Continued Weeks Claimed:** The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
