Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, August 2022 Continued Claims Drop to Lowest Level in Last 15 Years by: Laura Yetter, Senior Economist

Initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) in Wyoming continued to decline from prior-year levels in August 2022.

Initial Claims


There were 980 initial claims in August 2022, down from 1,282 in August 2021 (-302, or -23.6%). This amount is 3.9% higher than pre-pandemic levels of 943 initial claims in August 2019. Initial claims peaked in April 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and have largely trended downward since (see Figure 1).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (212), trade, transportation, & utilities (142), professional & business services (96), and leisure & hospitality (67; see Table 1, page 5).

Laramie (179), Natrona (160), Campbell

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(75), Sweetwater (60), and Albany (43) counties had the largest number of initial claims. In addition, there were 156 initial claims by out-of-state claimants (see Table 3, page 9).

Continued Claims




Figure 2: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Continued Weeks Claimed for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2012 to August 2022

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 8,807 in August 2021 to 5,870 in August 2022 (-2,937, or -33.3%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 2,869 to 1,805 (-1,064, or -37.1%; see Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7). There were 7,837 continued weeks claimed in August 2019, so current claims are 25.1% lower compared to prepandemic levels. In fact, there were fewer continued claims in August 2022 than any other month dating back to at least 2007.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (900), trade, transportation & utilities (690), government (524), and education & health services (510; see Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8).

There were more continued weeks claimed for out-of-state claimants (997) than any single county in Wyoming (see Table 4, page 9). The counties with the greatest numbers of continued weeks claimed were Laramie (943), Natrona (840), Fremont (535), and Sweetwater (385).




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, August 2021 and August 2022




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, August 2021 and August 2022




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, August 2021 and August 2022




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, August 2021 and August 2022

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
