Continued Claims Increase from Prior Year in November

ontinued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) in Wyoming increased from prior-year levels in November 2022. This marked the first over-the-year increase in continued claims since March 2021. Initial claims continued to decrease over the year.

Initial Claims

There were 2,223 initial claims in November 2022, down from 2,319 in November 2021 (-96, or -4.1%). This amount is also 18.7% lower than prepandemic levels of 2,735 initial claims in November 2019. Initial claims increased by




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2012 to November 2022

26.1% from October to November, following the usual trend as seasonal workers lose their jobs and file for UI benefits (see Figure 1).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (610), leisure & hospitality (325), government

(197), and professional & business services (183). Construction was one of few industries to show an over-the-year increase in initial claims (109, or 21.8%; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 4, page 6).

Laramie (305), Natrona (301), Teton (174), and Sweetwater (133) counties had the largest number of initial claims. In addition, there were 410 initial claims by out-of-state claimants (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9).


Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 8,795 in November 2021 to 9,130 in November 2022 (335, or 3.8%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 3,168 to 2,789 (-379, or

-12.0%; see Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7). Continued weeks claimed remained 23.1% lower than the 11,878 in November 2019 prior to the pandemic.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included leisure & hospitality (1,753), construction (1,433), government (859), and trade, transportation, & utilities (812; see Figure 5, page 8)

There were more continued weeks claimed for out-of-state claimants (2,118) than any single county in Wyoming. The counties with the greatest numbers of continued weeks claimed were Laramie (1,137), Natrona (1,021), Teton (965), and Sweetwater (523; see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9).



^{*}A person who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment then files a *continued claim* to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, November 2021 and November 2022




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, November 2021 and November 2022




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, November 2021 and November 2022




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, November 2021 and November 2022

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
