Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, June 2019

Initial Claims increase 78.3% in Manufacturing

The number of initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming in June 2019 decreased by 2.8% compared to June 2018. In addition, the number of continued weeks claimed decreased by 20.2%.

Initial Claims

There were 1,242 initial claims in June 2019, 36 fewer than the 1,278 in June 2018. The greatest decreases were seen in leisure & hospitality (-24 claims, or -19.2%), other services (-20, or -55.6%), and educational & health services (-19, or -10.4%). Manufacturing showed the greatest increase (31, or 73.8%), followed by construction (eight, or 3.0%).

At the county level, the greatest decreases were seen in Laramie County (-26, or -14.9%), followed by Campbell (-26, or -28.2%) and Goshen (-16, or -40.5%) counties. The greatest increases were seen in Fremont (24, or 25.6%), Crook (22, or

250.0%), Natrona (nine, or 5.0%), and Platte (nine, or 44.4%) counties.

Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed in June was 7,709, 1,946 fewer than the 9,655 in June 2018. The total number of unique claimants decreased from 2,889 to 2,509 (-380, or -13.2%), and the number of claimants who exhausted their benefits decreased from 1,185 to 271 (-914, or -77.1%).

Most industries showed a decrease in continued weeks claimed, including trade, transportation, warehousing, & utilities (-361, or -24.2%), leisure & hospitality (-343, or -29.2%), and educational & health services (-321, or -30.4%). The only industries that showed increases were nonclassified (126, or 16.3%) and natural resources & mining (24, or 4.4%).

Most counties showed a decrease in continued weeks claimed. Sublette County showed the greatest increase (25, or 39.7%).




Figure A: Total Number of New Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2009 to June 2019

Figure 1: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, June 2019





Figure 2: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, June 2019

Figure 3: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, June 2019





Figure 4: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, June 2019
