# Initial, Continued Claims Continue to Decline in July 2021

The number of Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming continued to decline in July 2021, and the 1,457 initial claims (see Definitions, page 9) were the fewest at any point since October 2019.

#### **Initial Claims**




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2011 to July 2021

July marked the fifth consecutive month of over-the-year decreases in initial claims, falling to 1,457 from 8,138 in July 2020 (-6,681, or -82.1%). Initial claims peaked in April 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and have largely trended downward since. *See Figure 1*.

Initial claims decreased across all industries, with the greatest declines seen




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, July 2020 and July 2021

in leisure & hospitality (-894, or -85.4%), mining (-644, or -91.1%), and construction (-579, or -71.2%). Claims in the industry labeled unclassified fell by 2,210 (-88.8%). Initial claims in government decreased by 78.1% (-363). See Table 1 (page 5) and Figure 3 (page 6).

The number of initial claims also decreased across all counties, led by




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, July 2020 and July 2021

Natrona (-1,185, or -83.0%), Laramie (-807, or -80.0%), and Campbell (-562, or -80.6%) counties. The number of out-of-state claims decreased by 1,141 (-83.0%). See Figure 4 (page 6) and Table 3 (page 9).


#### **Continued Claims**

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 73,590 in July 2020 to 10,691 in July 2021 (-62,899, or -85.5%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 18,097 to 3,506 (-14,591, or -80.6%). See Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7.




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, July 2020 and July 2021

Continued claims declined in all

industries over the year, including mining (-12,901, or -94.1%), leisure & hospitality (-9,449, or -90.4%), construction (-5,939, or -78.3%), and professional & business services (-3,810, or -83.6%). Continued claims in the industry labeled unclassified fell by 11,146 claims (-86.8%). See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, July 2020 and July 2021

Continued claims also fell in every county, with the greatest decreases seen in Natrona (-13,317, or -88.1%), Laramie (-6,743 or -82.9%), and Sweetwater (-5,203 or -85.9%) counties. The number of total weeks claimed by out-of-state recipients decreased by 9,096 (-84.6%). See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 6, page 8.

#### **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

**Continued Weeks Claimed:** The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
