Initial Claims Continue to Increase from Prior-Year Levels

The total number of initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming increased 12.1% over the year in December 2019. This marked the sixth consecutive month of over-theyear increase in initial claims, dating back to July 2019.

Initial Claims

Over the year, initial claims rose from 2,439 to 2,734, an increase of 295 claims, or 12.1%. The greatest increase was seen in natural resources & mining (166, or 146.9%), followed by unclassified (103, or 47.5%). Professional & business services experienced the greatest over-the-year decrease in initial claims (-64, or -22.7%). *See Table 1 (page 4) and Figure 2 (page 5).*

At the county level, the largest over theyear-increase was seen among out-of-state claimants, which increased from 318 to 529 (211, or 66.3%), followed by residents of Natrona (56, or 15.7%) and Sweetwater (22, or 11.4%) counties. Park County showed the greatest over-the-year decrease in initial claims (-52, or -37.5%). See Figure 3 (page 5).

Continued Claims

Total continued weeks claimed increased from 12,578 to 14,833, an increase of 2,255 weeks claimed, or 17.9%. The total number of unique claimants increased by 742 (18.3%), and the total number of claimants who exhausted their benefits increased by 93 (26.1%). See Table 2 (page 6).

Large over-the-year increases in continued weeks claimed were seen in several industries, including unclassified (846, or 84.6%), natural resources & mining (777, or 110.5%), and construction (710, or 22.0%). See Figure 4 (page 7).

Several counties also experienced large over-the-year growth in continued weeks claimed, including out-of-state claimants (797, or 28.5%), Natrona (546, or 36.2%), Sweetwater (477, or 59.8%), Laramie (286, or 19.0%), and Fremont (228, or 28.0%). See Figure 5 (page 7) and Table 3 (page 8).




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2009 to December 2019

Figure 2: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, December 2019





Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, December 2019

Figure 4: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, December 2019





Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, December 2019
