Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, December 2020

Initial and Continued Claims Both Decrease from November

Initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming decreased by 7.7% over the month, while total continued weeks claimed decreased by 1.1%. The overthe-month decrease in continued weeks claimed was the smallest for any month during the COVID-19 pandemic and followed six months of much greater decreases. Initial Claims

Wyoming had 4,739 initial claims (see Definitions, page 9) in December, down from 5,133 in November (-394, or -7.7%). Leisure & hospitality had the greatest overthe-month decrease in initial claims (-323, or -34.9%). Most other service-providing industries experienced smaller increases or decreases in initial claims, such as retail

trade (-27, or -11.0%) and wholesale trade (16, or 26.2%). Wyoming's good-producing industries experienced over-the-month increases in initial claims, including construction (352, or 33.3%), manufacturing (91, or 102.2%), and natural resources & mining (17, or 5.9%). Initial claims decreased or remained unchanged in all levels of government, including federal (-113, or -44.3%), local (-38, or -26.6%), and state (0, or 0.0%) government. 


Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2010 to December 2020

Several counties saw over-the-month decreases in initial claims, such as Teton (-295, or -76.8%), Park (-24, or -11.1%), and Lincoln (-22, or -19.8%) counties. Sheridan (51, or 34.0%) and Campbell (45, or 13.2%) counties experienced the greatest over-themonth increases. See Figure 4 (page 6) and Table 3 (page 9).


Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 32,402 to 32,057 (-345, or -1.1%). The total number of unique claimants decreased from 10,558 to 8,895 (-1,663, or -15.8%). See Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7.

Continued claims decreased in most private sector industries, including natural resources & mining (-910, or -22.3%),

leisure & hospitality (-568, or -12.5%), trade, transportation, warehousing, & utilities (-435, or -10.7%), and education & health services (-185, or -11.8%). These large decreases were largely offset by a substantial increase in continued claims in construction (1,547, or 31.4%). Wyoming regularly sees large over-the-month increases in continued claims in construction in December and January. See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.

Continued claims increased in 15 counties, led by Big Horn (204, or 75.6%), Laramie (187, or 5.3%), and Sweetwater (184, or 8.1%) counties. Over-the-month decreases were seen in eight counties, including Teton (-756, or -36.7%), Campbell (-331, or -11.7%), Natrona (-146, or -2.3%), and Converse (-145, or -14.1%) counties. 


Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, November and December 2020




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, November and December 2020

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


Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, November and December 2020




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, November and December 2020

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
