

Initial Claims

Initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming increased 10.4% (182 claims) from August 2015 to August 2016. Claims in natural resources & mining decreased 22.2% (50 claims) over the year. Substantial over-the-year increases were seen in construction (27.9%, or 104 claims), government (46.3%, or 50 claims), and leisure & hospitality (25.2%, or 28 claims).

At the county level, initial claims in Laramie County increased 30.8% (68 claims), while initial claims in Natrona County increased 6.3% (20 claims).

Continued Claims

From August 2015 to August 2016, the total number of unique claimants with continued claims increased 2.5% (133 workers). This was a much smaller over-theyear increase than the one that occurred from July 2015 to July 2016 (49.5%, or 2,388 claimants). Total continued weeks claimed increased 19.6% from August 2015 to August 2016.

Over the year, nearly all industries experienced increases in the total number of continued weeks claimed. The most significant increases from August 2015 to August 2016 were seen in wholesale trade (74.9%, or 575 weeks claimed), leisure & hospitality (47.6%, or 382 weeks claimed), retail trade (44.8%, or 383 weeks claimed), local government (40.7%, or 360 weeks claimed), and construction (27.6%, or 716 weeks claimed).


In Natrona County, the total number of unique claimants with continued claims increased 8.2% (77 claimants) over the year, and the total number of weeks claimed increased 25.3% (828 weeks claimed. In Laramie County, the total number of unique claimants increased 2.2% (11 claimants) from August 2015 to August 2016, and the total number of weeks claimed increased 16.4% (279 weeks claimed).




Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, August 2016




Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, August 2016
