

Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Information, January 2017: Decline in Continued Weeks Claimed, Unique Claimants

Initial Claims

Total initial claims decreased 21.7% (-580 claims) from January 2016 to January 2017. Initial claims in natural resources & mining decreased 68.2% (-419 claims) over the year. Most industries experienced an over-the-year decrease in the number of initial claims, with the exception of leisure & hospitality (7.4%, or 26 claims) and education & health services (4.5%, or five claims).

Most counties experienced a decrease in initial claims compared to January 2016. The most substantial decreases were seen in Natrona (-260 claims, or -32.5%), Campbell (-208, or -41.9%), and Fremont (-115, or -29.6%) counties. The number of initial claims for out-of-state claimants also decreased over the year (-168, or -22.5%). Initial claims increased in Laramie County (22 claims, or 4.3%).

Continued Claims

Over the year, the total number of unique claimants decreased by 1,191 individuals (-12.1%), while the total number of weeks claimed decreased by 4,056 weeks (-12.3%). These two metrics indicate that the number of individuals with extended unemployment claims has decreased and that those individuals with extended claims are having less difficulty finding employment, or are leaving the labor force.

As noted by Bullard (2016), Wyoming's employment in November 2016 was well below that of November 2015 (-3.735 individuals, or -1.3%) and the state's labor force declined throughout most of 2015 and 2016. The *labor force* is defined as the total number of the civilian non-institutionalized population age 16 or older who are employed or unemployed (jobless, looking for a job, and available for work).

Most industries experienced a decrease in the number of total weeks claimed. The most substantial increase was seen in natural resources & mining (-2,264 weeks claimed, or -54.4%). Retail trade experienced an increase of 310 weeks claimed (21.5%), while total weeks claimed in leisure & hospitality increased by 147 weeks (5.4%) over the year.


Most counties also saw a decrease in the number of unique claimants and the total number of weeks claimed. Natrona County had 232 fewer claimants (-14.6%) and 766 fewer weeks claimed (-14.3%), while Laramie County had 47 fewer claimants (-4.5%) and 127 fewer weeks claimed (-3.6%).



Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, January 2017




Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, January 2017




