## 2020Q1 Quarterly Update

## Wyoming Job Growth Slows Prior to COVID-19 Pandemic

This article provides an overview of Wyoming's employment and wages in first quarter 2020, just prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in Wyoming. The data presented are from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, available online at https://doe.state.wy.us/LMI/toc\_202.htm.

Jyoming employment grew by only 0.1% over the year in first quarter 2020 (2020Q1), just as Wyoming businesses and schools were beginning to shutter in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Total wages increased by 0.8%, the smallest over-the-year increase in total wages since 2017Q3 (see Table 2, page 4).

This article provides an overview of employment and wages in Wyoming at the industry and county levels for 2020Q1 based on data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW).

First quarter 2020 included January, February, and March, and business closures and job losses began towards the end of


March. Weekly Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims data from the Research & Planning (R&P) section of the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services first indicate a surge in new claims during the week ending March 21, 2020 (Glover and Moore, 2020). In other words, substantial job losses began at the end of the threemonth period discussed in this article, so the effects of the pandemic are generally not reflected in these data. Job and wage losses from the COVID-19 pandemic most likely will be seen in the QCEW data from 2020Q2, which will be available in the fall and presented in the October 2020 issue of Wyoming Labor Force Trends.

Weekly UI claims data present the closest thing to real-time data with regard to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on Wyoming's labor market. Claims data are updated each week and are available at https://doe.state.wy.us/LMI.

### Introduction

Wyoming's average monthly employment in 2020Q1 was 269,009, an increase of 270 jobs (0.1%) compared to 2019Q1 (see Table 1). The state's total wages equaled \$3.3 billion, an over-the-year increase of \$25.8 million (0.8%). The average weekly wage was \$955, up \$6 (0.7%) over the year.




Figure 1: Average Monthly Employment and Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment and Total Wages Across All Industries in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1

Wyoming experienced two periods of economic downturn over the last decade: 2009Q1 to 2010Q1 and 2015Q2 to 2016Q4 (see Figure 1 and Table 2, page 4). An

economic downturn is defined by R&P as a period of at least two consecutive quarters of over-the-year decrease in average monthly employment and total wages based on data from the QCEW. Both downturns were preceded by declining energy prices (Moore, 2019). As illustrated in Figure 1, Wyoming employment levels remain considerably lower compared to pre-downturn levels.

## **Industry**

Industries are classified by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). A sample of the NAICS hierarchal structure for mining (NAICS 21) can be found in the box on page 4. Table 3 shows employment and wages at the two-digit sector level. Tables showing more detail for the mining, construction, and leisure & hospitality industries (see Tables 4-7) are provided in this article

as well; those industry-specific tables include data for selected subsectors (three-digit), industry groups (four-digit), and detailed national industries (six-digit).

Employment in Wyoming's private sector decreased by 336 jobs (0.2%) over the year. Private sector industries that experienced a decrease in employment included mining (-1,271, or -6.1%), professional & business services (-170, or -0.9%), retail trade (-154, or -0.5%), and manufacturing (-146, or -1.5%). Industries that added jobs included leisure & hospitality (712, or 2.1%), construction




Figure 2: Average Monthly Employment in Private Mining (NAICS 21) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1




Figure 3: Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment and Total Wages in Private Mining (NAICS 21) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1

(343, or 1.7%), health care & social assistance (252, or 1.0%), and educational services (168, or 9.7%).

Total government added 606 jobs over the year, a 0.9% increase. Local government added the greatest number of jobs (378, or 0.8%), followed by state (138, or 1.1%) and federal (90, or 1.3%) governments.

## Mining, Including Oil & Gas (NAICS 21)

Employment in mining, including oil & gas declined from 20,997 in 2019Q1 to 19,726 in 2020Q1 (-1,271, or -6.1%). Mining contributed 7.3% of all jobs in Wyoming in 2020Q1.

Figures 2 and 3 show the downward trend in mining that began in 201903 and continued through 2020Q1. Figure 3 illustrates the substantial decline in employment and wages in mining during periods of economic downturn, particularly from 2015Q2 to 2016Q4. Employment and wages in mining increased from prior-year levels for two years (2017Q2 to 2019Q2) before the recent decline.

All three mining subsectors lost jobs in 2020Q1. The support

activities for mining subsector (NAICS 213) lost the greatest number of jobs (-1,005, or -10.1%).

Prior to the recent decline that began in 2019Q3, job growth in mining had largely been driven by the support activities for mining subsector, which includes drilling oil & gas wells, along with support activities for oil & gas, coal, metal, and nonmetallic minerals mining.

Wyoming's coal mining industry (NAICS 2121) lost 121 jobs (-2.3%) over the year. Employment in coal mining has largely trended downward over the last decade, with average monthly employment decreasing from 6,885 in 2010Q1 to 5,151 in 2020Q1 (-1,734, or -25.2%; Moore,

2020a). In other words, one in every four jobs in coal mining in 2010Q1 was lost over that 10-year period.

Employment in oil & gas extraction (NAICS 211) decreased from 3,036 to 2,852 (-184, or -6.1%). Job losses were seen in crude petroleum extraction (NAICS 211120; -111, or -6.5%) and natural gas extraction (NAICS 211130; -73, or -5.5%).

Total wages decreased from \$517.5 million to \$461.2 million (-\$56.3 million, or -10.9%). Total wages in mining accounted for 13.8% of the state's total wages in 2020Q1. By comparison, in 2010Q1, mining contributed 18.3% of the state's total wages.




Figure 4: Average Monthly Employment in Private Construction (NAICS 23) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1




Figure 5: Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment and Total Wages in Private Construction (NAICS 23) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1

### **Construction (NAICS 23)**

Figures 4 and 5 illustrate a prolonged period of job losses in construction that lasted from 2015Q2 to 2018Q1. Since 2018Q2, however, Wyoming job growth largely has been driven by the construction sector. From 2018Q4 to 2019Q4, construction added an average of 2,536 new jobs per quarter (Moore, 2020b). In 2020Q1, construction added noticeably fewer jobs over the year (343, or 1.7%).

A large part of the job growth in Wyoming during the last two years was seen in oil & gas pipeline construction (NAICS 237120). During each quarter from 2018Q1 to 201904, nearly one in three (31.0%) new jobs in Wyoming were in oil & gas pipeline construction on average (see Table 5, page 9). In 2018Q3, the 1,848 new jobs in oil & gas pipeline construction represented 80.0% of all new jobs in Wyoming. In 2020Q1, however, oil & gas pipeline construction lost 198 jobs compared to 2019Q1, the first over-the-year job loss since 2017Q4. Oil & gas pipeline jobs are often temporary, and the job losses seen in 2020Q1 may indicate that some large projects have reached or neared completion.




Figure 6: Average Monthly Employment in Private Leisure & Hospitality (NAICS 71-72) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1




Figure 7: Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment and Total Wages in Private Leisure & Hospitality (NAICS 71-72) in Wyoming, 2010Q1-2020Q1

As shown in Table 6 (see page 9), in 2020Q1, job growth in construction also was seen in both construction of buildings (NAICS 236; 39 jobs, or 1.0%) and specialty trade contractors (NAICS 238; 251, or 2.4%).

## Leisure & Hospitality (NAICS 71-72)

The leisure & hospitality supersector is comprised of two sectors: arts, entertainment, & recreation (NAICS 71) and accommodation & food services (NAICS 72). In 2020Q1, leisure & hospitality accounted for 12.9% of all jobs and 6.1% of total wages in Wyoming.

Figures 6 and 7 illustrate how leisure & hospitality has been somewhat immune to the sizeable increases and decreases in employment seen in industries such as mining and construction during periods of rapid growth and contraction. Wyoming's leisure & hospitality industry has seen slow, steady growth in employment over the last decade (see Figure 6). And while figures 3 and 5 (see pages 6 and 8, respectively) show job losses as great as 23.0% in mining and 11.8% in construction, leisure & hospitality job losses have only been greater than 1.3% once in the last decade.

While employment in leisure & hospitality has steadily grown over the last 10 years, data for 2020Q2 likely will show substantial job losses. Wyoming's leisure & hospitality sector was hit especially hard by the COVID-19 pandemic, with more than 4,000 new initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in both March and April (Wen and Moore, 2020). The 4,347 initial claims in leisure & hospitality in March represented 36.3% of all initial claims in Wyoming that month.

Average monthly employment in leisure & hospitality in 2020Q1 was 34,643, up 2.1% (712 jobs) over the year (see Table 7). The greatest job gains were seen in food services & drinking places (NAICS 722; 326 new jobs, or 1.6%) and accommodation (NAICS 721; 264, or 2.5%), followed by amusements, gambling, & recreation (NAICS 713; 113, or 5.0%).

Total wages were \$203.7 million, up 7.9% (\$14.9 million) over the year. Two subsectors contributed the vast amount of wages: accommodation (\$95.6 million) and food services & drinking places (\$89.7 million).

#### Average Weekly Wage

Figure 8 (see page 12) shows the average weekly wage for Wyoming by industry in 2020Q1. The statewide average weekly wage in 2020Q1 was \$955. The private industries with the highest average weekly wages included mining (\$1,799), manufacturing (\$1,401), wholesale trade, transportation, warehousing, & utilities (\$1,220), financial activities (\$1,192), professional & business services (\$1,072), and construction (\$1,018). The lowest average weekly wages were found in leisure & hospitality (\$452) and retail trade (\$585). Government had an average weekly wage of \$963, with the highest seen in federal government (\$1,273).




Figure 8: Average Weekly Wage in Wyoming by Industry Sector (2-Digit NAICS), 2020Q1

## County

Table 7 (see page 13) shows employment and total wages in Wyoming by county in 2019Q1 and 2020Q1. Over-the-year job growth was seen in Laramie (736, or 1.6%), Converse (433, or 6.4%), and Campbell (299, or 1.2%) counties. Job losses were seen in Sweetwater (-947, or -4.3%), Platte (-229, or -6.3%), Uinta (-148, or -1.8%), Sublette (-140, or -3.7%), and Goshen (-120, or -2.9%) counties, among others. The counties that experienced the greatest growth in total wages were Laramie (\$19.1 million, or 3.5%) and Converse (\$13.1 million, or 14.3%) counties, while total wages in Sweetwater County decreased by \$17.9 million, or 5.4%.




Figure 9: Average Weekly Wage in Wyoming by County of Employment, 2020Q1

As previously mentioned, mining had the highest average weekly wage of all industries in 2020Q1. This is reflected at the county level as well, as counties where mining had a large presence tended to have the highest wages, such as Sweetwater (\$1,143), Campbell (\$1,129), Converse (\$1,117), and Sublette (\$1,110) counties (see Figure 9, page 14). The lowest average weekly wages were often found in Wyoming's least populous counties, such as Hot Springs (\$726), Goshen (\$745), and Niobrara (\$740) counties.

#### Conclusion

Job growth slowed in Wyoming during 2020Q1, as average monthly employment increased just 0.1% (270 new jobs) over the year. Job losses were seen in mining (-1,271, or -6.1%), which historically has been a precursor to overall job loss in the state. In addition, the COVID-19 pandemic reached Wyoming toward the end of 2020Q1, resulting in business closures and job losses. The effects of

the COVID-19 pandemic likely will be apparent in the QCEW data for 2020Q2, which will be available in fall 2020.

## New from R&P: 2020 Wyoming Workforce Annual Report



he 2020 Wyoming Workforce Annual Report from the Research & Planning (R&P) section of the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services, in partnership with the Wyoming Workforce Development Council, provides a wealth of information on Wyoming's labor market. The new report is available online at https:// doe.state.wy.us/LMI/annualreport/2020/2020\_Annual\_ Report.pdf.

The annual report's authors looked at Wyoming's labor market

in 2019 by using data from numerous sources, including the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Wyoming wage records, Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS), Unemployment Insurance claims, and more.

Wyoming's economy experienced moderate growth in 2019, thanks in part to large oil & gas pipeline construction projects. The state's average monthly employment in 2019 was 276,927, up 1.7% (4,752 jobs) over the year, according to data from the QCEW

According to wage records, which represent an individual's wage history and provide a count of the number of people working in Wyoming, there were 350,192 individuals working in Wyoming at any time during the year in 2019, an increase of 1.7% over the year. The number of resident women and men working in Wyoming decreased over the year. In contrast, the number of nonresidents — individuals for whom demographic data are not available and typically commute to Wyoming from another state or country for work — increased by 24.2%.

The LAUS program provides estimates

on Wyoming's resident labor force, which includes all persons in the civilian noninstitutional population ages 16 and older classified as either employed or unemployed. In 2019, Wyoming's resident labor force was 292,258, with 281,730 employed and 10,528 unemployed, with an unemployment rate of 3.6% (number of unemployed divided by the total labor force). Wyoming's labor force declined each year from 2012 to 2018 before seeing a small increase in 2019.




Figure 1: Selected Components of Wyoming's Labor Market, 2009-2019

Figure 1 provides an illustration of 10 years worth of data from some of the sources identified in Table 1.

## Wyoming Unemployment Falls to 8.8% in May 2020

The Research & Planning section of the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services reported that the state's seasonally adjusted<sup>1</sup> unemployment rate fell from its revised level of 9.6% in April to 8.8% in May. It appears that the state's economy improved modestly in May as COVID-19 pandemic restrictions were loosened and some businesses reopened. At 8.8%, Wyoming's unemployment rate was significantly lower than the U.S. rate of 13.3%.


Most county unemployment rates fell from April to May, perhaps suggesting small scale improvement in labor markets around the state. The largest unemployment rate decreases occurred in Teton (down from 18.2% to 15.0%), Sublette (down from 11.4% to 9.8%), and Johnson (down from 9.7% to 8.1%) counties. Unemployment rates rose in Converse County (up from 6.4% to 7.3%) and Carbon County (up from 6.8% to 7.0%).

Unemployment rates were higher than a year earlier in all 23 counties. The largest increases were seen in Teton County (up from 2.9% to 15.0%), Natrona County (up from 3.7% to 11.7%), Campbell County (up from 3.2% to 9.7%), and Sweetwater County (up from 3.5% to 9.7%).

Niobrara County had the lowest unemployment rate in May at 4.5%. It was followed by Albany County at 4.9% and Weston County at 5.0%. The highest unemployment rates were found in Teton County at 15.0%, Natrona County at 11.7%, and Sublette County at 9.8%.

Total nonfarm employment in Wyoming (not seasonally adjusted and measured by place of work) decreased from 292,300 in May 2019 to 265,500 in May 2020, a decline of 26,800 jobs (-9.2%).





Seasonal adjustment is a statistical procedure to remove the impact of normal regularly recurring events (such as weather, major holidays, and the opening and closing of schools) from economic time series to better understand changes in economic conditions from month to month.


